Accreditation

The Centre received word that it has been accredited under the Quality Improvement and Accreditation System for Long Day Care Centres. It was great news and the staffs are delighted with the results. We received High Quality in all areas.



Healthy Little Ears

In Term 3, we will be implementing a nose-blowing program. The program focuses on children aged 3 – 5 years and their ability to blow their nose. Nose blowing has been identified as a way of managing middle ear problems in this age group. The program involves staff working with the children over 4 weeks, incorporating activities to promote nose blowing. Information sheets will be sent home weekly to parents as part of this program.



Reduction in fees:

You may notice that your accounts have been reduced. The fee reduction is due to the federal government increasing the amount they subsidise child care. On Wednesday 3 June 2009, the Minister for Education, Julia Gillard announced an increase in child care assistance to around 800,000 Australian families following the indexation of child care rates. Changes to Child Care Benefit rates and income thresholds and to the maximum amount of Child Care Tax Rebate will provide extra help to families with the costs of child care from 1 July 2009. The increases are a part of the Australian government's \$12.8 billion investment over the next four years to help Australian families with the costs of child care.



Healthy Eating

Emily and Rochelle attended a course in Parkes called Munch and Move, which taught them about healthy eating and how to encourage children to be more active. With the information learnt, it has

given the centre some ideas on promoting healthy lunch box alternatives. Starting as of next term, we are going to trial, within each room, a simple morning and afternoon tea that provides only healthy foods (fresh fruit and veggies). All these ideas are to encourage the children not to eat pre-packaged foods (cakes, chips etc) that are high in sugar, salt, preservatives and colourings. Families are asked that instead of sending a full lunchbox to cover meal times at the centre, they send in 2 pieces of fruit. This will be shared among the children, during morning tea and afternoon tea, which will encourage them to try new foods and develop their self-help skills for the older children who serve their own foods.

For lunch, individual meals will still be necessary. Some ideas to continue with the healthy eating approach could be:

- Bread roll, lavish breads
- Sandwich
- Tub of yogurt
- Piece of cheese
- Sao's
- Tub of custard
- Tins of tuna

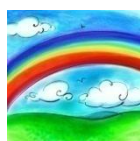
