## The Book Fair

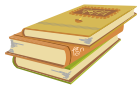

## Head Lice

There has been a case of head lice at the Centre so please keep checking your children's hair each day. A confirmed or suspected case of head lice on a child at the Centre is exclusion until appropriate treatment has started.

### HOW DO I KNOW IF MY CHILD HAS HEAD LICE?

Many head lice infections cause no symptoms, and probably less than half cause itch. Therefore, you have to LOOK to find out if your child has head lice. Do not rely on itching and scratching. Eggs are not difficult to see; use a strong light and look on the hair shafts. Newly laid eggs are usually within 1.5cm of the scalp while older eggs are higher up the hair shafts. If you are not sure whether an object you find is a head louse egg, try sliding it up the hair shaft. Eggs are usually quite difficult to move, whereas hair muffs and other items slide easily. However, finding live lice can be difficult since the climbers move away quickly from disturbances in the hair, and they are very difficult to see. An easy way to find the climbers is to use the conditioner and nit comb technique:

1. Apply conditioner to dry hair aiming to cover each hair from root to tip with a layer of conditioner.
2. Detangle the hair using an ordinary comb.
3. Immediately comb the hair with a fine toothcomb.
4. Wipe the conditioner off the fine toothcomb onto a paper tissue and look for lice and eggs.

Repeat the combing for every part of the head at least 5 times. If you find lice, your child should be treated immediately.
