Helping Your Child Settle In

Coming to a childcare centre for the first time can be a big step for children and parents. Children all react differently to change. Some children and parents are uncomfortable with change and can find this initial settling in period difficult to manage. The settling in process needs to be individualised for each family. It is important for us to know how you and your child are feeling during this time. We want to be a support during this time of transition. Please talk to us so we can help you by addressing any concerns and issues.

Parent Involvement

It is important to establish a good relationship with all parents at our service. Only through effective communication between staff and families, can the needs of the children and families be met.

Family Service Plan

Over the next few weeks, we are asking you to look at your family service plan and perhaps either discuss them with your room teacher or just fill them out and leave with a staff member. Forms are available from the staff in each room. Filling them out will help to provide an even better standard of reaching goals for your children in our Centre.

Visitors

Occupational Health and Safety Regulations require the Centre to get all visitors to sign in and out of the Centre. A visitor is any person, other than parents picking up and dropping off their children, who will be staying at the Centre longer than 10 minutes. The visitor's book is located in the foyer

Library



Children are able to borrow books from our library. If you bring your child to the Centre, please select a book with your child and complete

your child's library card.

Please write down the title of the borrowed book on the supplied library cards and tick it off when returned. For children travelling on buses, staff will assist children with borrowing a book. Please pack a library bag (not plastic) and children can select their library book on arrival. Reading to your child is an essential part of helping your child to learn to read

Jobs, Education and Training (JET) Child Care

JET Child Care fee assistance helps with the cost of approved child care for eligible parents undertaking activities such as work, job search, training, study or rehabilitation as part of an activity agreement, to help them enter or re-enter the workforce. Please remember to label all of your child's clothing, lunch boxes and drink bottles.

Notice of change to booking forms must be completed for all changes. They are available from the website, the Foyer at the centre or you can ask any staff member and they will be happy to help.

Grenfell Preschool and Long Day Care Centre is a not for profit organisation. We endeavour to maintain a fee structure that is affordable and sustainable. Grenfell Preschool and Long Day Care Centre delivers a high quality educational service, which is subsidised by the Federal and State Governments however, to meet the Centre's financial commitments and keep our wonderful resources for the children up to date, we remind everyone that accounts should be paid within 14 days. Children's positions will be cancelled if the Centre's policy is not being met.

Fun Day in the Park

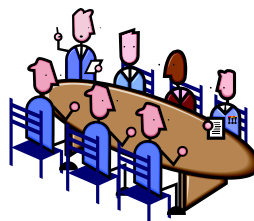
Each term we try to hold a function that involves all our families and friends at the centre. This term we are having a fun day in Taylor Park on the 27th March at 5pm.

No Bake Jam Drops

These No bake treats are delicious. Try using half weet bix and half-rolled oats for a nuttier treat.

Ingredients:

2 ½ cups crushed Weetbix

2 tablespoons of honey

1 cup of softened butter

½ cup of icing sugar

Strawberry jam

Method: Mix butter, icing sugar and honey together until smooth. Stir in the cereal thoroughly. Place a large piece of baking paper on a flat baking dish and spoon the mixture on to the paper in a small serving amount. Lightly pat the small mounds down.

Add a small dollop of your favourite jam in the centre of the cookies. Refrigerate for at least 30 minutes. Store in air – tight container in the fridge. Makes approximately 3 dozen jam drops

Human Swine Influenza

This winter, a new influenza A virus, H1N1 influenza 09 (formerly called human swine influenza), will continue to spread in NSW, along with other influenza viruses seen each winter. H1N1 influenza 09 produces a mild illness in most, a severe illness in some and is a moderate illness overall.

Children aged 0-4 years had had the highest rate of hospitalisation. Please see your local practitioners about vaccination
