Happy Mother's Day

Last week was wonderful listening to the children tell us why they liked their mums and where they were going to hide the cards they made their mothers. I smiled when I listened to Ben and Joe say they were going to hide them under their Dad's clothes in his drawers and under the bed because Mum never looks there.

Validator's Visit

At long last we have had our validator's visit as part of the steps to Accreditation. For two days the valuator observed and interviewed to obtain evidence that our Centre is following the 7 Quality areas and 33 principals of accreditation. I am pleased to report that the Grenfell Preschool & Long Day Care Centre did extremely well, however we will have to wait another 6 weeks for the moderator to send the final decision.

Staffing

The committee has employed another early childhood teacher, Emily Riley from Orange, to cope with the high number of children attending our centre. With the numbers being so high in the Star Room, this will be a great opportunity to add Emily to that room to assist with the care and running of the room. Emily and Belinda will work together taking turns with the music program and the greeting in the morning. The children will be divided into 2 language groups where each teacher will be able to do more one on one work with the children to prepare them for school in 2010. Both teachers will be working towards the same goals. Each teacher will have 21 portfolios and will be available to meet with the families to discuss their children.

Leanne Walsh is away and Lisa Jones and Zovi Armstrong have been working in the Rainbow Room. Both Lisa and Zovi are qualified child care workers who take pride in their work and the children adore them. Belinda Stevens has also been at the Centre helping us out. This week Tracey McKellar will also be working in the Rainbow room.

Health and Safety

There has been a suspected case of the measles reported to the Centre however it has not yet been confirmed.

Measles is a highly infectious and serious viral illness. It begins with fever, tiredness, a cough, a runny nose and inflamed eyes. These symptoms usually worsen over 3 days. The cough tends to be worse at night. The child may avoid light because the eyes are inflamed. At this stage, there may be small white spots on a red base present in the mouth on the inside of the cheek. Between days 3 and 7, a rash begins at the hair line. The fever will still be present when the rash begins. In 24–48 hours, this will spread over the entire body. When the rash reaches the legs, the rash on the head and face begins to fade. The rash usually disappears after 6 days. Measles lasts about 10 days. The cough may be the last symptom to disappear. A child with measles usually feels very ill. In a fairly high number of cases, the measles virus causes serious complications, such as pneumonia or

inflammation of the brain. That is why there is so much concern about the disease. Measles is not a simple childhood disease. The number of cases in Australia has fallen dramatically over the past 10 years as a result of immunisation programmes and other public health measures.

Incubation period

8–14 days, usually 10 days.

Infectious period

About 4–5 days before the rash begins until the fourth day after the rash appears.

Exclusion period

Exclude for at least 4 days after the appearance of the rash.

Responsibilities of parents

Observe the exclusion period. If the child feels unwell, keep them home until they are feeling better.

Advise any friends, family or social contacts that your child has measles. These contacts may need to seek medical advice if they are pregnant, unimmunised or have a medical condition which compromises their immune system.

Controlling the spread of infection in the centre

Measles is best prevented through immunisation with the MMR vaccine.

Children should be immunised at 12 months of age and again at 4 years of age. The vaccine gives lasting immunity. All childcare staff born during or since 1966, either without vaccination records or are negative on blood test should be vaccinated both for their own protection and to avoid the risk of infecting their pregnant colleagues.

If your child does not attend on the Tuesday they are still very welcome to attend the eye screening service but need to be accompanied by an adult. Parents wishing to have their children's eyes checked must complete a permission note I apologise for putting the wrong date in an early newsletter. If your child is not book in that day please bring your child from 9am. They should finish screening around 12pm.
